

5C - Clayton County Community Collaboration Council
Meeting Minutes **12-21-16**

Attendees: Claudia McCalley (Community Member), Tim Engelhardt (Law Enforcement), Tracy Yelden (Substance Abuse Agency), Adam Sadewasser (Substance Abuse Agency), Nancy Yelden (Healthcare), Jackie McGeough (School), Safire Zinkle (Youth), Amber Hickman (Youth), and Marissa Reichard (Youth).

Claudia opened the meeting with review of the packet materials (attached) before moving into the action items of the agenda. With the proposed new meeting format, all reports from grants and partners will be provided in written format before, during, and after the meeting to maintain partner awareness. Please take a moment to review the attached packet of information.

- 1) The coalition watched 15 minutes of Coalitions 101 for training purposes. An overview will be provided in the quarterly newsletter.
- 2) Tracy summarized what the DFC carryover funds could be used for and the coalition discussed the carryover purpose. Adam moved to approve the carryover amount of \$24,051.01 as outlined, Nancy second the motion, motion passed.
- 3) The group viewed the 2 minute AC4C beer tax awareness video and then discussed the possibility of the coalition signing a statewide document in support of raising the beer tax. The coalition agreed raising the tax was a good idea, however, before signing their name they would like to see the official document that will be distributed.
- 4) Other items discussed: the MFL Mar Mac Wellness Fair could be an opportunity for 5C and the SODA group to partner for a booth and provide the driving simulator and goggles. The Tag-It contest is coming in February as well as a opportunity for area youth to attend Day on the Hill. If any youth leader is interested in taking youth to this event (February 23rd) please contact Tracy.

Event/Meeting Summary

5C Executive Board Meeting Minutes (12/5/2016) - Present: Julie Doeppke, Claudia McCalley, Adam Sadewasser, Tracy Yelden, Merry French

Old Business: Budget was discussed; Incoming \$50 for RRW Sponsor, Expenses for trailer decals and chamber bucks to come. DFC will spend funds to purchase t-shirt designs chosen by students. IPFS Update: interviews are complete and waiting on background checks. Work is continuing as much as possible (media, MIP, social host). Tracy will reorder table tents as we are out. Merry will touch base with Marvin on MIP policies. Saturation/Safety Checkpoints are on hold until warmer weather. HIPS: Claudia will complete a HIPS summary of Monona event for meeting packet. SASCC will pay \$500 to 5C for conducting the HIPS exhibit in Monona as a THM. (Payment directly to FHH to pay down loan.) Tracy will ask Rose if she can sew Velcro strips to hold curtain up. Group needs to develop a tote with local resources/brochures to keep with exhibit. DFC Update: The 5C Youth IMPACT Group will host a youth event over the holidays in Guttenberg. Details to come. Discussed having a table at a basketball game in January. Upcoming trainings: AC4C, NCA, and REACH with ECS.

New Business: The group decided to host a planning retreat on January 26th, 9am-12pm in Elkader. More info to come. Tracy will follow up on a scheduling a Drug Trends presentation as discussed in the November 5C meeting. The December coalition meeting will cover a training on Coalitions 101 and February will be another training by webinar led by Heidi from ECS. Tracy will the countywide law enforcement group to ask about a December meeting. The Board also elected to purchase coalition polos to utilize at events (Tracy will purchase from DFC funds.)

AC4C Retreat Summary (12/5&6/2016) – Tracy attended Alliance of Coalitions for Change (AC4C). From this retreat, information was shared regarding the following: 1) QGIS is a database/software program that can be used to create an interactive map of contacts and resources. This may be useful as a resource guide in the county. 2) Iowa Pharmacy Association (Representative Anthony Pudlo) is creating messaging materials for prescription disposal (poster and bag stuffer). If a pharmacy is interested in having a dropbox, contact Tiffany for more information. The IPA asks coalitions to inquire if local doctors are using the Prescription Monitoring Program and if the coalition can help promote this program. 3) The Iowa Department of Public Health (IDPH) is coming out with a new grant (SPF Rx) in September for three counties to address prescription issues. Encouraged coalition members to attend the Governor's Conference in April on substance abuse. 4) The Traffic Safety Bureau reported that traffic deaths are up by 73 from this time last year. The driving simulator is available to those interested in utilizing for texting or under the influence demonstrations. A 2-day class for the Drug Recognition Expert is available for those interested. Interesting fact: most alcohol related fatalities are 1st time OWI and have a BAC level of .125 or .167. If everyone was under .08 BAC, we could save 7000 lives nationally. 5) The Office of Drug Control Policy released state strategies – alcohol is trending down, marijuana trending up, meth demand is strong, synthetic drugs have tanked, opioid is a hot topic in resources. They are available to put drug dropoff boxes in law enforcement offices.

Pregnancy prevention – Adam - Classes are currently being taught at EDCO and Central Elkader. Classes are scheduled at CR and Starmont in the spring as well as the remainder of Central.

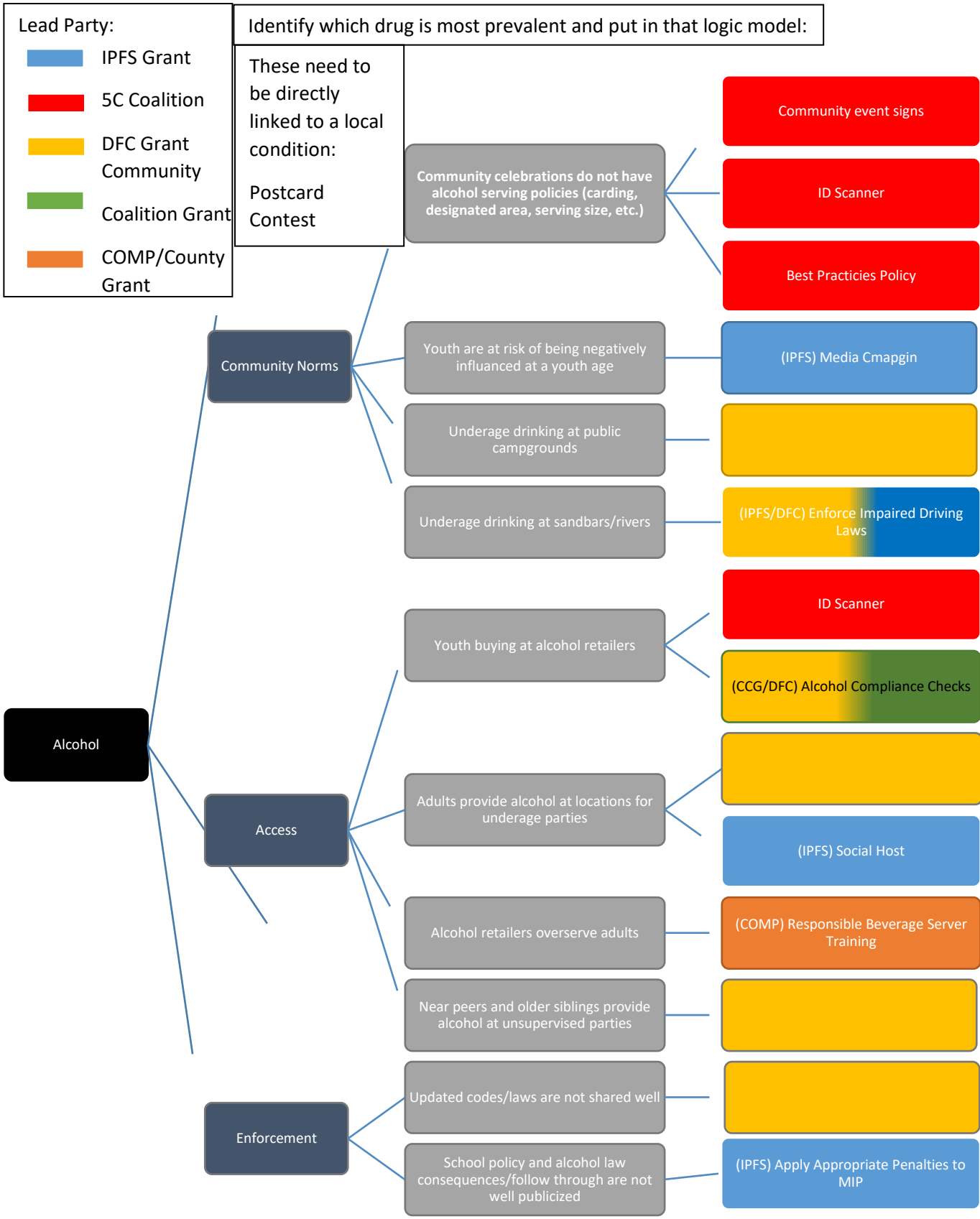
Tobacco – Adam - Tobacco questionnaires were sent to all county businesses, several businesses have requested Quitline information and help with tobacco free policies. The MFL SODA group continues to meet monthly and is working on ideas for events during the winter months.

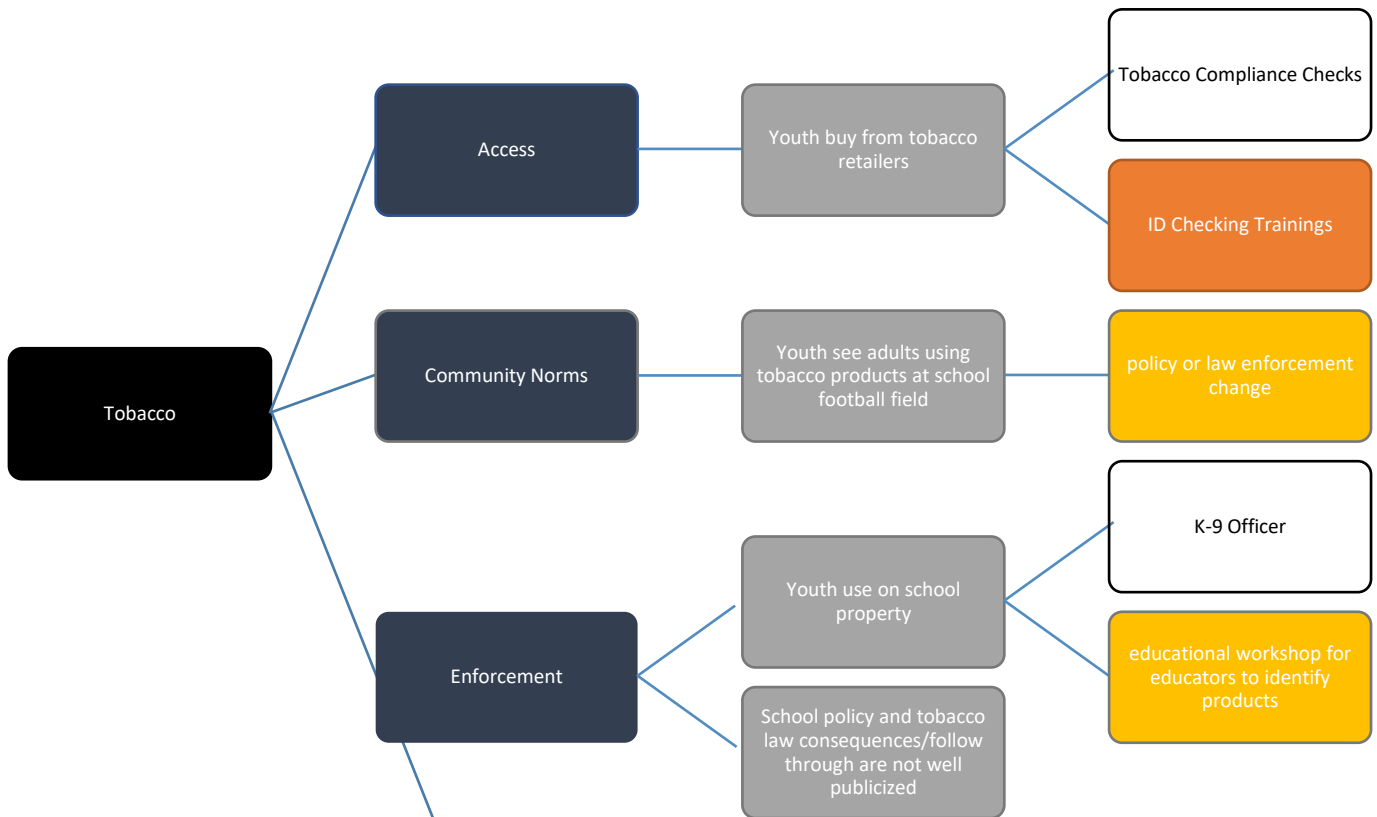
Community Coalition Grant – Tim is working on this quarter's compliance checks, so far only one sale. Certificates will be ready in January to go out to businesses.

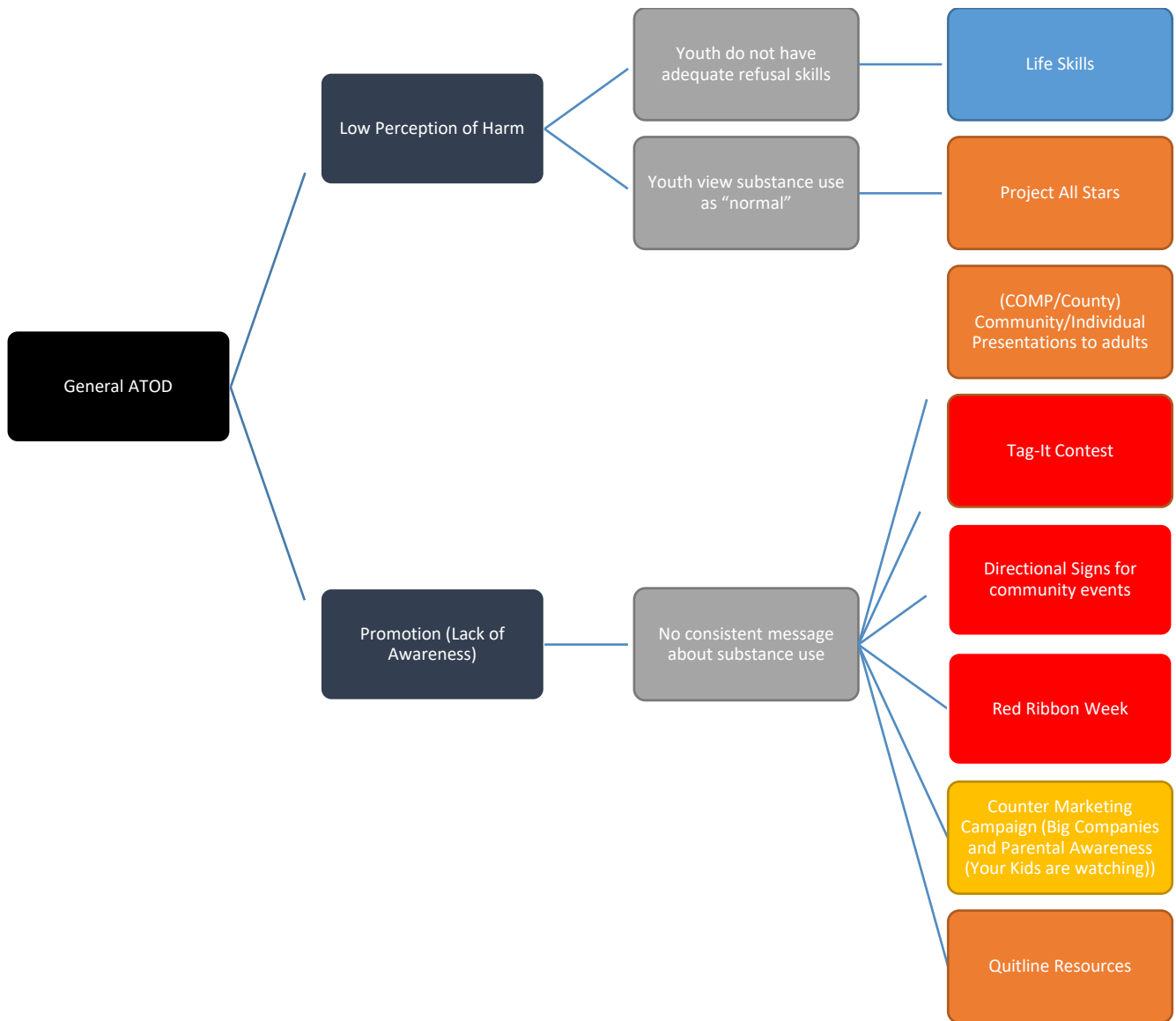
Clayton County Foundation for the Future – Funds are being spent on Chamber Bucks from Strawberry Point, Elkader, Guttenberg, and McGregor/Marquette. Giftcards from Subway and Casey's. Also \$220 towards youth t-shirts with drug free messaging. Tracy will complete the report needed by Dec. 31st.

Drug Free Communities (DFC) Grant – Tracy Yelden – a 5C Youth IMPACT Group met on Dec. 12th to plan a game night during holiday break. This event will be from 4-11pm to provide an alternative activity for youth in the community. The goal is to repeat similar events monthly on weekend nights. This group will also look into creating messaging on substance use to their peers in the coming months. The REACH evaluation system is up and running and will allow the coalition to track their activities to provide better reports and summary of events/activities throughout the year. A training on Coalitions 101 will take place at the December coalition meeting as well as in February on Coalition Capacity. A community wide presentation on Drug Trends is also being scheduled for March 23rd in Garnavillo. The Hidden In Plain Sight will be available during P/T conferences in February. A small glitch in the Core Measures Survey prevented the survey from being completed as scheduled. Tracy is working with admin to complete this survey as soon as possible.

Iowa Partnerships for Success (IPFS) – Merry - Rachel Hach has accepted the position of IPFS Coordinator and will begin work with SASCC on Monday, January 16, 2017. Please welcome Rachel and assist her in the transition. The “What Do You Throw Away” media campaign is still running on KCTN and through Facebook ads. Marv Duff is still collecting and reviewing policies regarding “Apply Appropriate Penalties to Minors in Possession of Alcohol.” Safety checkpoints and saturation patrols will be implemented in the spring. The Social Host table tents were distributed to a number of area businesses and a new supply has been ordered.







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
